Course Description

This course is intended to teach advanced laparoscopic techniques for various digestive diseases. Through live surgical demonstrations with real time interactions between the participants and the surgeons in the operating room, and hands-on laboratory experience with these surgeons, the participants will learn valuable surgical techniques as well as operative indications, and surgical strategies to improve laparoscopic surgical outcomes.
